High safety marks for all but two Boston Harbor region beaches

Public beaches in the Boston Harbor region scored high overall in terms of water quality safety, according to the latest report card, but two continue to lag far behind.

The latest Metropolitan Beaches Water Quality Report Card, released Saturday by Save the Harbor/Save the Bay shows two South Boston beaches have the safest water quality, followed by Nantasket Beach in Hull and another two beaches in Southie.

However, Save the Harbor/Save the Bay Executive Director Chris Mancini did point out that King's Beach in Lynn and Swampscott and Tenean Beach in Dorchester continue to show poor water quality scores. Mancini also pointed to poor communication from the state Department of Public Health, in terms of alerting beachgoers to water quality risks last year.

He said 75% of the red flags, which indicate tests have found unsafe levels of bacteria in the water, that flew at Constitution Beach in East Boston in 2021 were wrong, while an "astonishing" 100% of the red flags on that beach were incorrect in 2020.

"Sadly the Department of Public Health's beach posting and flagging protocols failed to make the grade again this year," Mancini said.

The annual report card ranks the safety of DCR-managed public

beaches in Dorchester, East Boston, South Boston, Hull, Nahant, Lynn, Quincy, Revere and Winthrop.

The rankings for the beaches with the highest average safety rating from 2016-21 were: Pleasure Bay at 100%, City Point at 99%, Nantasket at 99%, M Street at 98%, Carson at 98%, Revere at 96%, Winthrop at 95%, Constitution at 94%, Nahant at 94%, Short at 90%, Wollaston at 89%, Savin Hill at 89%, Malibu at 88%, King's at 78%, and Tenean at 77%.

The overall six-year rating for the 15 beaches was 92%. However, the report card showed the overall water quality rating was down 7% in 2021 - 86% to the previous year's 93% score.
